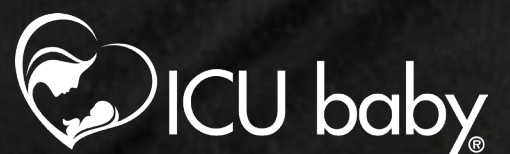

# About ICU baby



## Mission

ICU baby unites NICU families and provides emotional, financial and informational support so that babies and families can thrive together.

## Vision

To build a community of NICU families who empower each other to be confident and present in their own NICU journeys, leading to better outcomes.





## History

ICU baby was founded in 2014 out of personal experiences and in direct response to the need for a greater framework of support for families with a baby admitted to the NICU. Our first program was launched on World Prematurity Day in 2015 at Baptist Health's South Miami Hospital and programs were launched at UM/Jackson Memorial Medical Center's Holtz Children's Hospital exactly one year later. Since then, ICU baby has continued to introduce critical and innovative programming to meet the needs of NICU families in our South Florida hospitals. This Fall 2023, ICU baby was proud to expand and bring programs to the NICUs of Nicklaus Children's Hospital, Mt. Sinai Medical Center and HCA Florida University Hospital.

# Welcome

## Dear ICU baby Friends and Family,

Thanks to your generous support, 2023 was a year marked by exciting growth and an even more united South Florida NICU community!

We walked into the year with big plans and walked out of 2023 with tremendous gratitude for all that we were able to accomplish to serve more NICU families.

We experienced **growth in our core programming**, touching the lives of even more families at Holtz Children's Hospital and South Miami Hospital. We increased the number of Meaningful Meals we hosted for families and brought back our ICU Read program so that babies spent less time alone and had the benefit of the auditory stimulation from a storybook being read to them. We also met more parents and siblings on the floor of the NICU during our bedside visits, offering them much-needed support and, at times, a hug. And, we increased the amount of financial support we gave to families who could otherwise not afford to be at their baby's NICU bedside with our Transportation Assistance Program.

We experienced growth by **expanding to three new hospitals** - Nicklaus Children's Hospital, Mt. Sinai Medical Center and HCA Florida University Hospital! Families with babies in these NICUs now have access to our NICU Empowerment Support Tools (NEST) Program, which provides critical information about the NICU and additional community resources to support their needs.

We experienced growth by **launching the ICU baby App!** Yes, finally ... "there's an app for that!" We are proud to share that now families have access to ICU baby at the palm of their hands, which includes our NICU videos, journaling capabilities, a guidebook and even a photo log.

We experienced growth by **adding a new meaningful and moving event** to our roster - the **Little Miracles Luncheon** - defined by the Runway of Hope fashion show. NICU grads and their mother or father proudly graced the runway, sharing their heroic NICU journey and celebrating how far they've come at this special luncheon.

And, all of this growth and the very meaningful, tiny, quiet moments with NICU families one-on-one could not have been done without your generous support, in the time you volunteered or the money you gifted to us. **All of our work for our NICU community is possible because of you, and we could not be more grateful.**

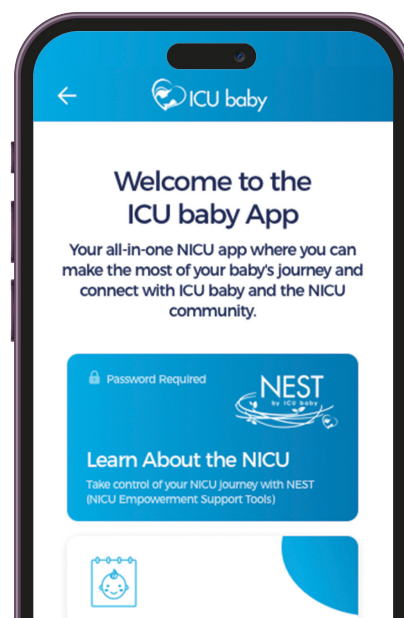

In 2023, we celebrated the launch of the ICU baby App, which brings families free and convenient 24/7 access to our informational support programming, including NEST by ICU baby. The app is available in English, Spanish and Haitian Creole as are all of our ICU baby programs.





# Programs



## Bereavement Support

A memorial gift and grief support from parent mentors who also had a baby die in the NICU. Financial assistance with funeral arrangements for families of low-income levels.



## ICU Read

The ICU Read Program brings pre-screened ICU baby volunteers into the NICU to read to babies who are not visited often or may need extra stimulation and love. ICU baby Readers provide a comforting voice to sooth the babies as they rest.



## Meaningful Meals

Cuisine and Crafts and Suppers of Support events provide a catered meal and connect fellow parents with a baby in the NICU for peer-to-peer support.



## NEST - NICU Empowerment Support Tools

A guidebook and journal, video library and online resources to provide parents with access to information so they can better understand and experience the NICU.



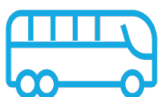
## NICU Pack

A tote bag filled with essential NICU items to help parents care for and bond with their baby alongside the healthcare team.



## NICU Parent Mentor

One-on-one mentorship for NICU families from a veteran NICU parent. Support is offered bedside in the NICU and via tele-support.



## Transportation Assistance

Monthly stipends to offset transportation costs for families whose visits to the NICU are limited because of financial hardship.



## Volunteer Initiatives

Opportunities to support NICU families through mentorship, hosting meals, packing NICU packs, supporting events, offering professional services or serving as a Youth Ambassador.

# Hospital Expansion



ICU baby is proud to have partnered with three additional hospitals this Fall to support families with a baby in their NICU. Now, ICU baby supports nearly 300 NICU beds, reaching more NICU families every day.

Expansion to the additional hospitals was made possible by funding from the Florida Department of Health, directed to ICU baby's NICU Empowerment Support Tool (NEST) materials. Specifically, ICU baby was able to print hundreds of copies of NEST's My NICU Baby Book - A Companion Journal and Guidebook - for South Florida NICU families so they would have the benefit of all of the resources our NEST program offers. The book connects with an online website and a library of videos that orient them to the NICU and provide much needed information to help them navigate their baby's NICU stay. The NEST is a tri-lingual program, with all materials produced in English, Spanish and Haitian Creole, making it accessible to the diverse body of families ICU baby serves. ICU baby hopes to continue a strong partnership with the Florida Department of Health in Miami-Dade County to ensure that all families in South Florida have access to NEST and support while their baby is in the NICU.





ICU baby began programs in South Miami Hospital in 2015 and Holtz Children's Hospital in 2016. We are proud to have continued our commitment to support NICU families in these hospitals without interruption over the years and thank the hospitals for their partnership.



# Emotional Support

## NICU Parent Mentor

Our NICU Parent Mentor Program includes 19 mentors who have each experienced the difficulty of having a baby in the NICU. Now, they volunteer 2-5 hours, week-after-week, to ensure that families with a currently admitted baby have access to the emotional support they need at their baby's hospital bedside or over the phone. Mentors serve as active listeners and, when appropriate, connect parents to outside resources they may need to have a better NICU experience. Thanks to United Way Miami for being one of our several supporting partners for this program.

## ICU Read

Our ICU Read Program brings pre-screened ICU baby volunteers into the NICU to read to babies so that they spend less time alone and receive extra stimulation and love. Research shows that early reading leads to improved language development in babies and ICU baby Readers provide a comforting voice to sooth the babies as they rest.

## Bereavement Support Program

Our Bereavement Support Program helps families who experience the death of their baby in the NICU. The grief support team includes volunteers who also experienced the death of a NICU baby and members of our Parent Mentor Program. Grieving parents have the opportunity to receive the support they need after their devastating loss.

“ A child dying in the NICU is an incredibly difficult and often traumatic experience. It impacts every aspect of the bereaved family's lives. A child isn't supposed to die and the parents are often left with suffocating grief. One of the biggest predictors of how the family copes is social support. Strong social and clinical support provides the invaluable gift of space and time to talk about their babies and bear witness to the grief in a safe and supportive process. ICU baby volunteers connect to families in their most difficult days, offering a gentle and compassionate place to grieve. Being present for grieving families reduces feelings of isolation and assists the families in navigating their painful emotions. ”

# Meaningful Meals

Our Meaningful Meals Program offers families a catered meal and an opportunity for peer-to-peer support from other families with an admitted baby. We host Cuisine & Crafts during the lunch hour and Suppers of Support in the evenings. The bonds that form and the smiles that are had at ICU baby's Meaningful Meal events are a welcome respite from the stressors the families endure in the NICU.

The Junior League of Miami partnered with us this year to host our Supper of Support meals at Holtz Children's Hospital, further uniting the community with NICU families.

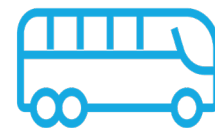

## NEST

Our NICU Empowerment Support Tools (NEST) are a targeted effort to increase parents' NICU health literacy so they can more confidently and competently care for their baby in the hospital.

The NEST is a series of three information channels - a book, a video series and online resources - designed to be accessible to parents with diverse backgrounds and different NICU journeys. Like all of ICU baby's programs, all NEST resources are available in English, Spanish and Haitian Creole. Thanks to the Florida Department of Health in Miami-Dade County for being one of our several supporting partners for this program.

Our ICU baby Parent Mentors & Bereavement Mentors have had a NICU experience and volunteer for up to 5 hours weekly, offering psychosocial support in the NICU and telephonically.

### 230 Project Volunteers

Our project volunteers are groups from around the community who gather to prepare NICU Packs and gifts.

### 15 Professional Volunteers

Our professional volunteers include members of our leadership team helping with day-to-day operations and our Board of Directors guiding the strategic growth of the organization.

### 44 Event Volunteers

Our event volunteers ensure our Celebration of Miracles, Hope Parade and Little Miracles Luncheon run smoothly.

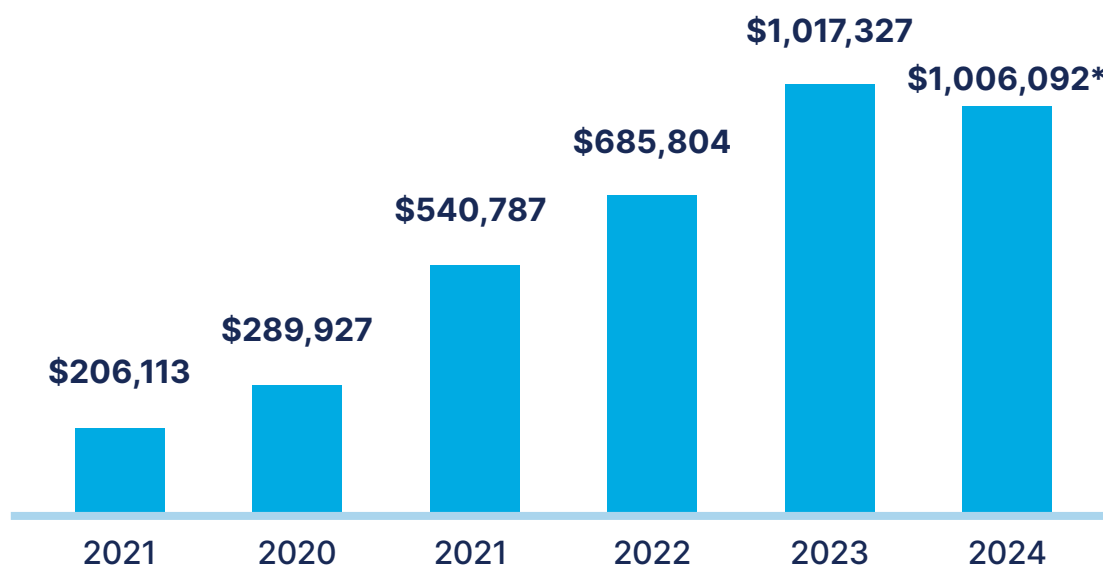
